## Learning skills that we are practising this half term:

### **English**

#### The Iron Man by Ted Hughes

In guided reading, we will be reading The Iron Man. We will be focussing on looking deeper into texts and reading between the lines.

In English lessons we will be using The Iron Man to inspire non-fictional and fictional pieces of writing. Our main focus this half term is to become secure in the use of correct punctuation.

We will be looking at these national curriculum objectives:

- Organising paragraphs around a theme.
- Composing and rehearsing sentences orally.
- In narratives, creating settings, characters and plot.
- Evaluate and edit by: Assessing the
  effectiveness of their own and others'
  writing and suggesting improvements,
  proposing changes to grammar and
  vocabulary to improve consistency,
  including the accurate use of pronouns in
  sentences, proof-read for spelling and
  punctuation errors, read aloud their own
  writing, to a group or the whole class,
  using appropriate intonation and
  controlling the tone and volume so that
  the meaning is clear.

#### **Maths**

We will be focussing on: Decimals and Money.

This topic will include:

- Writing tenths and hundredths.
- Writing decimals.
- Comparing and ordering decimals.
- Making number patterns.
- Rounding decimals.
- Writing fractions as decimals.
- Dividing numbers by 10.
- Dividing numbers by 100.
- Writing amounts of money.
- Comparing amounts of money.
- Rounding amounts of money.
- Solving word problems involving money.
- Estimating amounts of money.

We will be also continuing with daily mental maths to become more secure in mastering number bonds to 100 and times tables.

#### **Science**

This term we are looking at living things and their habitats. We will be focussing on classifying different species using keys. This will involve outdoor learning and we can use forest school to enhance investigations. This topic will cover identifying different groups of animals, then narrowing these groups down further using a key. Firstly, we will learn how to read and use keys to identify different animals. Then we will develop our skills in creating our own keys to use for identification.

We will be looking at these national curriculum

## **Computing**

This half term we are learning about html and how to begin creating websites. We will be editing html and URLs to edit programmes. Using secure websites, we will be exploring the workings behind websites and designing out own. Whilst learning

Our Geography topic will be covered during forest school sessions. We will be focussing on reading the eight-point compass. As well as this we will be continuing with some map work and looking at grid references.
